HOMELESSNESS IN AMERICA



FACTS

- Accurate statistics regarding the number of children without homes are difficult to obtain, as the homeless population is constantly in flux
- Children experiencing homelessness are 9 times more likely to repeat a grade
- Children experiencing homelessness are 3 times more likely to be placed in special education
- 1 in every 30 American children goes to sleep without a home each year
- Approximately 2.5 million children are homeless annually in the United States



TAKE ACTION:

ASSEMBLE Care Kits Work together to assemble these kits as a family, then deliver to a local homeless shelter or keep in your car if you'd like to personally give to someone who is homeless.

- Go Shopping. Think about what you might like in a care kit & stock up.
 Suggested items include toothbrushes, toothpaste, lip balm, tissues, hand sanitizer, snacks, socks & gloves.
- Personalize. Use paper and markers to create cards of encouragement & joy. Messages like "Have a great day,"
 "Thinking about you" or "Rainbows ahead."
- **Deliver**. Find a local homeless shelter and drop off your care kits. Alternatively, keep some in your car & distribute as you come across recipients.




Help kids imagine what homelessness would feel like...
